Parameters for preparation of Site Plan

While preparing a site plan for the protected area, the prohibited and regulated areas, the following parameters shall be adhered to and incorporated.

(a) protected area, protected monument, prohibited area or regulated area

Parameters:

- (i) Contouring (1 metre interval) is preferable. However, it can vary depending on nature of landscape. If it is hilly terrain with cliffs, then contour intervals can be increased. If the landscape is plain, then it can be reduced to 0.5 metre.
- (ii) Fixing of bench mark and survey points on the ground and map;
- (iii) Protected area needs to be mapped in such a manner that property and feature within the area can easily be identified. Therefore the area shall be required to be gridded both on map and ground. Grid can be of 50 x 50 metres;
- (iv) Mapping of structures on plan;
- (v) Other features like tank, embankment, mud fortification, remnants of ancient structures etc should be shown;
- (vi) Roads and pathways;
- (vii) Garden area;
- (viii) Trees (with an inventory- tree type, width and height);
- (ix) Telephone Lines
- (x) Sewerage Lines
- (xi) Water supply lines, etc.
- (xii) Contouring / Relative height of certain areas.
- (xiii) Ground Penetrating Radar survey determining the buried, archaeological remains.
- (xiv) Any other feature that is required to be incorporated in consultation with the competent authority;
